Alistair Gentry is a writer and artist, or an artist and writer. He has worked nationally and internationally in the visual and performing arts, and was a founder member of the artist-led East Anglian research and development group Market Project (2010-2013, supported by Escalator/Arts Council England).

4.10 Independent artist Lawrence Bradby Lawrence Bradby is an artist, part of the collaborative practice Townley and Bradby.

Last year Lawrence ran a series of public discussion events at firstsite gallery (Colchester) called 'Artists On The Gallery Payroll' looking at the relationship between an institution and the artists that it employs. For the Living Wage event Lawrence will present data on the earnings and employment status of artists in Norwich. He will link this to wider economic issues and the recent report from the Social Mobility and Child Poverty Commission.
